Haiti Update: Two Months after the Earthquake

It has been two months since the destructive January 12 earthquake shook Haiti. GP Caribe Atlantic Area Director Dan and Joy Irvine sent the following update:

All of you have seen images of destruction, loss of life, tent cities, and homeless people. In the midst of so much hopelessness we have seen hope. In the first six weeks over 120 medical and logistical people gave their time and energy to the people of Haiti by working in the Petit Goave clinic as well as the LaGonave hospital. Many more from other organizations worked alongside our teams tirelessly treating the injured.

Over 50 tons of food and relief supplies have been distributed in more than 60 communities through the generosity of people in New York and Washington. Three young men spearheaded the loading and delivery of four containers. Six weeks later, Caleb Thompson, one of the young men, is still on LaGonave working with food distribution.
